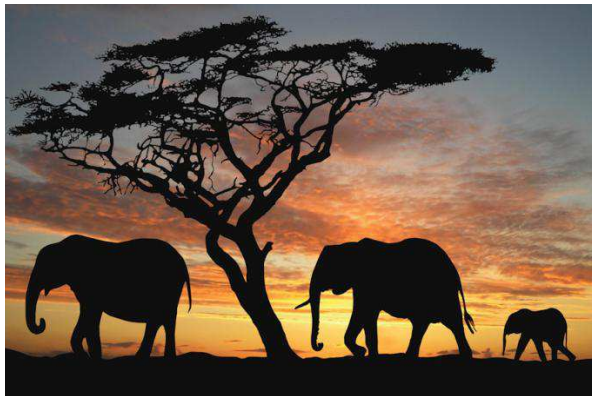


Hi everyone! Welcome back to another English Extravaganza. For this week's English speaking country, I am going to tell you about South Africa.

South Africa is the southernmost country on the African continent and has 11 official languages, including English. South Africa is often called the “Rainbow Nation”, because there are so many different languages and cultural traditions(文化的伝統). South Africa

has two countries inside it, which are Swaziland and Lesotho. Also, the Atlantic Ocean and the Indian Ocean meet off the coast.

The food in South Africa is very diverse. The South African staple food(主食) for the locals is “mealies”, which is corn, and vegetables, like potatoes, beans, carrots and peas. South Africans love their meat, and game meat(狩猟肉) such as kudu and springbok are common. However, most people eat beef, chicken, lamb and ostrich with their meals. One food that I want to try is koeksisters(ひねりドーナツ), which are said to taste like donuts with sweet sauce!



Wildlife in South Africa is abundant(豊富な). There are many kinds of antelope(アンテロープ、レイヨウ; 主にアフリカ産のウシ科でシカに似た体型のほ乳類) such as kudu, springbok, wildebeest, and impalas. When you go on a safari, you can see many other South African animals like lions, elephants, giraffes and monkeys. South Africa is home to the African Penguins, and the Great White Sharks live in the ocean waters there, too. Sometimes beaches are closed for bathing due to(～の

せいで) the sharks in the bays.
